

Infant Formula Offered

All day care homes and child care centers participating in the USDA Child and Adult Care Food Program that care for children under the age of one year are required to furnish and offer at least one iron-fortified formula that meets the definition of infant formula according to State and Federal guidelines.

Definition: Infant formula means any iron-fortified formula intended for dietary use solely as a food for normal, healthy infants; excluding those formulas specifically formulated for infants with inborn errors of metabolism or digestive or absorptive problems. Infant formula, as served, must be in liquid state at recommended dilution.
